Thursday evening 50 of the Royal Irish Artillery, under the command of Capt. A fire broke out last Tuesday night, in a Cabin belonging to John Green, labourer, near Donass, which burned down the same, and in which his wife and two infants unfortunately perished.

At a Meeting of the Freeholders of the County of Limerick, convened at St. Francis'-Abbey, pursuant to Notice, on Saturday, the 20th of July, 1793.

The following Resolutions, proposed by Wm. Thos. Monsell, Esq; and seconded by the Right Hon. Lord Carbery, were unanimously agreed to:—

**W**HEREAS in many Parts of this County, Persons have Assembled for the Purpose of administering and exacting unlawful Oaths, and for other Turbulent and seditious Purposes, and have had the Audacity to attack Charles Silver Oliver, Esq; for his spirited Exertions to suppress such illegal Acts, and to fire on the Army, under the command of the Civil Magistrate, when called forth to his assistance.

Resolved, That we are firmly determined to take the most decisive measures to put an effectual Stop to such Proceedings, and to bring to Condign Punishment all such Persons as shall be concerned therein.

Resolved, Therefore, that we do hereby pledge ourselves to each other and to the County, to attend in Arms, whenever called on by the High Sheriff or a Magistrate, in support of the Peace of the County, and that we will act for that time under the Command of the Sheriff or Magistrate so calling us out.
