A fire broke out last Tuesday night, in a Cabin belonging to John Green, labourer, near Donass, which burned down the same, and in which his wife and two infants unfortunately perished.

WHEREAS in many Parts of this County, Persons have Assembled for the Purpose of administering and exacting unlawful Oaths, and for other Turbulent and seditious Purposes, and have had the Audacity to attack Charles Silver Oliver, Esq; for his spirited Exertions to suppress such illegal Acts, and to fire on the Army, under the command of the Civil Magistrate, when called forth to his assistance.
