Major Peter Daly is appointed Governor of the garrison of Galway, in the room of the late Major General Sandford.

A noble Lord was recently arrested at Bath, by a tradesman of this city for so trissing a sum as 1401—His Lordship could not there plead a privilege for not paying his debts, as he could on this side of St. George's channel.—The bailists were sude, and his Lordship was obliged to be so complaisant as to raise the money. He has however withdrawn his custom from the raical who was so ill-bred as to look for the payment of a debt which had been four years due.

Monday last being the birth-day of the Prince of Wales, the Longford Militia (which has the honour of being called his Royal Highness's regiment,) were drawn up in the square before the barracks, and with due ceremony received the colours from their commander, the Earl of Granard.

His Lordship, in a handsome speech impressed upon the Corps, how much it ought to be flattered by the distinction of bearing the device of the Prince of Wales, and the additional tye it thence should feel of devotion to his Royal Father.

We hear through a letter from Wexford, that a foldier belonging to a company of the army in that town, ran into his quarters a few evenings fince all bloody, having two of his fingers out off—many of his irritated comrades proceeded to a lane where he faid he was affaulted, and were preparing to wreak their vengeance on the inhabitants or their boufes, when fortunately it came out, in full proof, that the milcreant himself was the perpensator of the act I—He was immediately secured.

The Downparrick affizes, held before Lord Carleton, ended the 7th inft. at which the following perfores were tried:

William Rickets, a private foldier, found guilty of the murder of A. M'Connell, fentenced to be hanged on the 8 h inft.—but being afterwards recommended by the Grand and Petit jury, was ordered to remain till further notice.

Felix Colgrave, revenue-officer, tried and acquitted of the above murder.

John Woodenek and John Smyth, both foldiers, were also tried and acquitted of said a murder. It appeared that all these soldiers went with Cosgrave to make a seizure at night —but that the above named Rickets, found guilty, fired without orders.

In a London print (The World,) it was afferted with the greatest confidence, that the French were in such want of failure, that "they were obliged to man their fleet with woman!"

On Monday night the seditions orators who have declaimed for some time past on the Exchange steps, got a most severe besting from a sew private gentlemen, who had provided themselves with oak sticks, and attended the meeting, uninvited, for the purpose of convincing the orators that there was a stronger mode of reasoning than with words.
