Monday last being the birth-day of the
Prince of Wales, the Longford Militia (which
has the honour of being called his Royal High-
ness's regiment,) were drawn up in the square
before the barracks, and with due ceremony
received the colours from their commander,
the Earl of Granard.

His Lordship, in a handsome speech impres-
sed upon the Corps, how much it ought to be
flattered by the distinction of bearing the de-
vice of the Prince of Wales, and the additional
eye it thence should feel of devotion to his
Royal Father.

We hear through a letter from Wexford,
that a soldier belonging to a company of the
army in that town, ran into his quarters a few
evenings since all bloody, having two of his
fingers cut off—many of his irritated comrades
proceeded to a lane where he said he was af-
flicted, and were preparing to wreak their
vengeance on the inhabitants or their houses,
when fortunately it came out, in full proof,
that the miscreant himself was the perpetrator
of the act.—He was immediately secured.

The Downpatrick assizes, held before Lord
Carleton, ended the 7th inst. at which the
following persons were tried:

William Ricketts, a private soldier, found
guilty of the murder of A. M'Connell, sen-
tenced to be hanged on the 8th inst.—but be-
ing afterwards recommended by the Grand
and Petit jury, was ordered to remain till fur-
ther notice.

Felix Cosgrave, revenue-officer, tried and
acquitted of the above murder.

John Woodcock and John Smyth, both sol-
diers, were also tried and acquitted of said
murder. It appeared that all these soldiers
went with Cosgrave to make a seizure at night
—but that the above named Ricketts, found
guilty, fired without orders.

In a London print (The World,) it was as-
serted with the greatest confidence, that the
French were in such want of sailors, that
"they were obliged to man their fleet with
women!"

On Monday night the seditious orators who
have declaimed for some time past on the Ex-
change steps, got a most severe beating from a
few private gentlemen, who had provided
themselves with oak sticks, and attended the
meeting, uninjured, for the purpose of convin-
cing the orators that there was a stronger mode
of reasoning than with words.

The great electrical battery, at Haerlem,
which contain 550 square feet of coated sur-

necessary duty.
