

Cork, for the use of said Troops.—A draft of eight men from the detachment of Artillery here, with Lieut. Coulson, marched hence on Monday last, to join the above division.

On Sunday last an ancient custom was revived in this city; that of the several Corporations of Tradesmen assembling with their colours, &c. &c. to attend the chief Magistrate, Recorder and Sheriffs to the Cathedral Church; after each of the Masters had presented Henry D'Este, Esq; the newly appointed Mayor, with a cockade, they proceeded to Church, where an excellent Sermon was preached by the Rev. Dr. Maunsell; after divine service they perambulated the different streets of this city, preceded by the band of the 34th Regiment, and made a most elegant and pleasing appearance; in the course of the perambulation, Henry D'Este, Esq; our chief magistrate, repeatedly expressed the high sense he entertained of the honour conferred on him; and from the confidence placed in him by the trades, &c. he requested that these, and all his fellow citizens, may be assured, that the peace and prosperity of the City of Limerick, was the nearest wish to his heart, and should be his constant study to promote.

Sunday evening Lieut. General Malley, arrived at his seat at Elm, in this County;—he is to review the King's County Royal Militia, at Loughmore, on Thursday next.

Monday last at a Common Council, the Freedom of this City was unanimously voted to Sir Laurence Parsons, Bart, Lieut. Col. Commandant,—Henry Peasley, Lieut. Colonel,—and William Warner Westleson, Esq; Major of the King's Co. Royal Militia.

Same day, Benjamin Friend, Esq; Walter Widenham, Esq; Eaton Maunsell, Esq; and Sir Christopher Knight, Aldermen, were sworn in Charter Justices of the Peace for this City, for the ensuing year.

Yesterday at the Quarter Sessions, in the City Court, a new Grand and Market Jury were sworn in for the ensuing Quarter, before the Right Worshipful Henry D'Este, Esq; Mayor; Anthony Dwyer, Esq; Assistant Recorder, and the Bench of Justices.

HEARTH-MONEY.

THE Second Clause in the Act of the last Session of Parliament, for granting duties on Fire-Hearths, which exempts houses of a certain description from the Duty, having been misconceived, and several persons who were not within the description of those which the Act exempts, having unwarily sworn the Affidavit, required by the Act to exempt them, it is thought necessary to give the following explanation:

The Clause exempts a House containing not more than one Hearth, where neither the person or persons inhabiting it, nor any other person using it, hath, useth or occupieth for that year, any Land, Tenement or Tenements, or any COT-TAKE or CROPHOLD, for the Crop or by the Year, of their own or of others, of a greater YEARLY VALUE than 5l. or is not worth 10l. in GOODS or CHATTELS.

The words "HATH, useth or occupieth" include not only all that the person or persons may hold in his, her, or their own immediate occupancy, but also what may be held under them by others.

The words "Any Land, Tenement or Tenements, or any COT-TAKE or CROPHOLD, for the Crop or by the Year, of their own or of others," include all Lands, Houses, Tenements, Grazing, Con-acre, Potator-ground, Meadow-ground, Flax-ground, &c. &c. whether of their own or held together or separate from one or more persons or Landlords, by Lease or at Will, for the Season, the immediate Crop, a Year, Years, or other Term or Time.

And their "YEARLY VALUE" is unequivocally what they would let for, at the full improved rent, either separately or together.

"Goods and Chattels" include all personal property, such as Household Furniture of all kinds, Money and Securities for Money, all Working, Farming and Manufacturing Tools and Implements, all Goods, Raw or Manufactured, Provisions, Cattle of all kinds, the Crop of Potatoes, Corn, Hay, Flax, &c. whether growing on, or in, or severed from the ground, the Value of a Lease for Years in any Holding, &c.

Therefore no House containing not more than one Hearth in which any person inhabits, who hath, useth or occupieth any Land, Tenement, or any Cottake or Crophold, &c. &c. above the yearly value of 5l. whether the rent or rents agreed to be paid amount to so much or not, nor whether the rent be paid in Money or otherwise, nor whether the rent be paid or not can be exempted from the Hearth-Money, and though the person may not have any holding worth 5l. a year, yet if he or she is in possession of property of the value of 10l. though at the same time, he or she may be in debt, the House is not exempted.
