The Baron de Vaux claims a lineal descent from an emigrant family of Grant, in Scotland, that followed the fortunes of the exiled House of Stuart, and his sons passport both from the Directory and the Duke of Portland, was in the name of Grant.— We repeat what we said in the first instance on this subject; we do not know that he had any political mission, we stated only the fact, that he was there with the knowledge of Government, and dispatched in the way, and at the time, we specified. We believe also that he is expected speedily to return.

### DUBLIN,—FEBRUARY 25.

Tuesday a Proclamation was ordered for a General Fast to be observed on Wednesday, the 9th of March next, in this kingdom.

Yesterday came on the trial of Patrick Hart for High Treason. The indictment was similar to those upon which Weldon and Kennedy have already been convicted. The Jury sworn consisted of the following Gentlemen:

The Sol. Gen. stated the case for the Crown. Wm. Lawlor, Alderman James, Oliver Carleton, Esq; and Mr. P. Godfrey, were the witnesses for the Crown.—The testimony was nearly the same which has been already given on the former trials of Weldon, &c.

To discredit Lawler's evidence, N. Clare, W. Ebbs, and William Rochfort, were produced.

In addition to Lawler's evidence, an engrossed parchment, containing the Defender's oath, was produced by the witness Godfrey, and proved to have been found in the breeches sob of Hart, when taken.

At half past one o'clock the Jury retired, and in five minutes returned a verdict of—GUILTY.
