The Esther and Hercules, transports, with troops on board, which put into Kinsale, the 11th inst. failed from that harbour last Friday morning, to join the Canada and fleet that passed the Old Head on Thursday evening.

A ship from Plymouth with Naval Stores, arrived at the Dock-yard, Kinsale, last Thursday.

On Sunday night a decent farmer of the name of Shinnick, who lived at Ballyrosheen, came to the desperate resolution of murdering his wife, and then put an end to his own existence. The instrument he used for this purpose was a razor, and the loss of a considerable sum of money by robbers was the inducement.
