

in the afternoon, were accidentally broke out in a back house in Gort, occasioned, it is supposed, by the carelessness of some carpenters who were at work, by lighting chips.—Its effects were so rapid, owing to a strong wind at the time, that in the space of little more than an hour it consumed upwards of twenty houses, mostly stables and store-houses, and three malt-houses. Several very respectable inhabitants of Gort are considerable sufferers on this melancholy occasion, having lost spirits, teas, sugars, malt, &c. to a large amount. The humane and spirited behaviour of Lieutenant Todd and Lieutenant Arthur, and the party of the Antrim Militia at present quartered there, was truly meritorious and praise worthy; on the first alarm they assembled with the most prompt alacrity, and by uncommon exertions not only afforded the most effectual protection to the inhabitants, whose goods were removed into the streets in a hurry incident to and unavoidable on such alarming occasions, but also contributed in the most effectual manner to stop the progress of this devouring element.

Same day a fire broke out at Mr. John Foster's, at Buyane, near Gort, which consumed the out-offices, before it could be extinguished.
