The defences of Turin, of which the fortrels of Suza is the chief, are to the northward of the city; the French are now to the fourth-weit of it.

General Buonaparte, who commands at present the Republican army in Italy, is about thirty years of age. Under the ancient regimen, he was an officer of artillery, and injoyed the reputation of being a man of talents. He is a native of Corfica, and fon to the codevant Gover-

nor of Calvi, in that Island.

The Senate of Venice, acceding at length to the defires of the French Government, has ordered Louis XVIII. to revire immediately from the territories of the Venetian Republic.
