LIMERICK, —MAY 20.

On the 4th inst. the Sally French Privateer, took off the Lizard. the Kitty, M'Donnell, from London for this Port, laden with Merchants' goods, which she sent for France; on the 19th she took the Fly of Biddeford, for Galway, and on the 20th captured the Ellen & Mary, Bannatine, and the Hind, Jameson, both from London for this Port; the two latter were re-taken same evening by the Hazard sloop of war, and carried into Cove on Tuesday last;—the sloop of war continued in chase of the privateer, which is reported has been taken;—the crews of the captured vessels were put on board fishing vessels, who landed them at Kinsail.
