

country. The enemies of Washington are not likely for the present to accomplish their object. There is no ground, however, to expect that they will relinquish their design, or neglect any means of giving energy to their opposition. The Treaty with Great Britain was but a mere circumstance in the business—it only furnished an apt occasion for giving vent to an accumulated mass of virulence, which rankles in the bosoms of a too numerous party in that Republic: The truth is, that Jacobins, whatever soil they tread, or whatever air they breathe, must be turbulent by a necessity of nature;—obedience and tranquility—contentment and cheerfulness, are mean and beggarly virtues to which it is impossible for the grandeur of their souls to stoop; it is not this, that, or the other species of Government which annoys them—it is any Government whatever, so long as it is in any hands but their own—Formed, as they imagine, to *command*, how should they be induced to *obey*—born to give *Laws* to all the world, it would be an annihilation of their dignity to submit to *law* themselves—They are not such fools as to be insensible of the tendency of their principle; they must know, that when set in action, they are more coercive of human happiness than the sweep of the hurricane, or the burst of the volcano: that murder and rapine—havock and devastation—misery and despair, must, while nature is nature, and man is man, ever be their fell concomitants.

The late Hon. William Henn, who died a few days ago at his house in town, enjoyed a pension of 800l. since he retired from the Bench. On the 28th ult. arrived in the Lough of Strangford, his Majesty's Revenue Cutter the Buckingham, Captain Hopkins, from a cruise, having captured a large smuggling lugger called the Neptune, laden with a valuable cargo of tea, tobacco and brandy. The lugger is quite a new vessel, pierced for 16 guns, had 6 six-pounders mounted, and a number of men.

KING'S-BENCH.—Tuesday, May 31. The Provoft and Fellows of Trinity College, v. Theophilus Swift, Esq;—for a Libel. The Information consisted of four counts, tending to shew that the Defendant had written, and caused to be published, a Pamphlet entitled "Animadversions on the Fellows of Trinity College," with a view to vilify and traduce that Corporate Body. The Solicitor General stated the case on the part of the Crown with great ability. Mr. Folingsby, Book-seller, in Dame-street, proved the printing of the Pamphlet, by order of the Defendant. Mr. Barrington, Counsel for Mr. Swift, made a most able defence for his client. Doctors Barret, Fitzgerald and Elrington, were brought forward and examined as witnesses. The Jury, after a consultation of half an hour, found the Defendant—Guilty.
