

It will give pleasure to every well wisher of the trade of this City to hear, that with other articles of export which have rapidly risen in demand, that of Butter is among the first:—about thirty years ago, it is in the recollection of many, that orders for Butter from Limerick were greater than from any other part of Ireland; it unfortunately happened that on account of the frauds committed, that the commissions visibly declined, and until within these three years, Limerick Butter literally *stunk* at Foreign markets; the reverse is now the fact, and we have it from the authority of a respectable Merchant no ways concerned in this City, to do justice to (Mr. Riedy,) the Person appointed as Public Inspector, or Taster of Butter, to add, that in London, &c. every cask from Limerick, according to the quality marked, bears a price superior to those from any other market in this kingdom.

A paragraph having appeared in our last, which we quoted from the English papers, mentioning that a number of persons, of the Methodist persuasion, had been killed in Leeds, by the fall of a loft, we are authorized to inform the public, by the Rev. Dr. Coke, who arrived in town yesterday evening, that the melancholy accident did happen, but that the persons alluded to were not connected with that Society.

to communicate to the Limerick Committee their Determination of withdrawing all further Pecuniary Support from the Proceedings, then carrying on.

They expressed most candidly and unequivocally, that they had adopted that measure, for the purpose of co-operating in the most effectual manner, for establishing the Rights of the Citizens: They were desirous, as they declared, that the Proceedings, then depending, for excluding from the Franchises those, who were unduly and illegally admitted, should be proceeded on with Vigour, Oeconomy and Dispatch, while they, upon their own part, would in like manner exert themselves for prosecuting the other Branch of the Enquiry, for ascertaining and establishing the Rights of those, who should be entitled to their Freedom: Accordingly Mr. D. Gabbett, their Agent, was directed to proceed by the Committee of Mr. Maunsell's Friends: Council were employed and consulted in the last Term, of which Intimation was also given and further Arrangements were making for instituting this latter Enquiry. They have been since not a little surpris'd to find, that Measures have been lately adopted for the purpose, as it seems, of taking out of the Hands of the Committee of Mr. Maunsell's Friends, the Conduct of those Proceedings, which they, upon their Part, candidly communicated their Intention of pursuing. The Committee of Mr. Maunsell's Friends feel themselves called upon to appeal to the Citizens of Limerick, whether Mr. Maunsell and his Friends have not shewn themselves upon every Occasion zealously attached to the Interests of the Citizens, and whether they are not therefore entitled to their Confidence and Support.

They beg leave also to submit, that as the General Election is now approaching, the Friends of the Independence of the City of Limerick should nominate those, whom they would support, as Candidates to Represent them in Parliament, as well as those, to whom they would commit the conduct of the Proceedings for asserting their Rights.
