

The Pearl of America, Captain Jenkins, was met off Cape Clear, by the Hazard, Captain Parker, about 3 weeks since, who pressed 12 of the passengers.—These passengers had received the sanction of the Privy Council for emigrating from their native soil.

The Guadaloupe packet, Captain Curin, of this port, with a valuable cargo of provisions, soap, candles, linens, &c. for Martinico, was taken by the French in long. 37. lat. 17.

On Monday morning, a duel was fought by two Gentlemen of Bandon, near Youghal, in the county of Waterford; one of the Gentlemen received the ball of his antagonist near the wrist of his left hand, which he held on his breast, it took a direction round the arm bone through the tendons, came out near the bent of the arm and lodged in the flesh above it.—Such are the painful consequences of duelling.
