STAMP-OFFICE.

THE Commissioners for managing the following Sections of Stamp Duties, passed in the late Act, to be published for the information of the Public, Section LI. "And be it enacted, That any Receipt shall be given, pressed in such Receipt; and all Persons who accept any Receipt in which a less sum than the sum actually received, or the Duties, or shall divide the same, or shall, by any gift or Use of the Word 'settled' or 'deavour to evade the Duties, or be in any fraudulent Contrivance, of any of the Duties on Receipts, so giving or accepting such Receipt, or so receiving a less sum than the sum actually received, or the Duties, shall forfeit the Moiety thereof to be paid to the Exchequer for the same, and the other to be paid to the Party so receiving the same."
LIV. "And be it enacted, That any Receipt for a sum not amounting to Ten Pounds, and containing the Words 'in full of all Demands,' shall be given as a general Acknowledgment, and being discharged, may be given in Evidence, and shall be available in law for such Sum as a general Acknowledgment of all Debts."
LV. "And be it enacted, That any Receipt for a sum with a Stamp of Two-pence, in which the sum is expressed, and not amounting to Two Pounds, and which shall contain the Words 'in full of all Demands,' shall be given as a general Acknowledgment of all Debts, and being discharged, may be given in Evidence, and shall be available in law for such Sum as a general Acknowledgment of all Debts."
LVII. "Provided always, That all Receipts for Rent shall be paid by the Debtor, and receiving such Rents."
LVIII. "And provided also, That any Person receiving such Rents, who shall, upon Demand, refuse to give a Receipt for the same, shall forfeit the sum of one Pound, and the other half of the same, and the other half shall be paid to the Party so receiving the same."
