Esq; of Waterford, (one of the respectable society of Quakers) visited and minutely inspected the House of Industry and Hospital for Lunatics in this City, his observations thereon are worthy his benevolent heart; and if the fund was adequate to the carrying of his directions into execution, they would instantly be adopted by the Treasurer; Mr. S. left in the poor-box half a guinea towards the repairs of the windows. — It would take every shilling in the Treasurer's hands to supply the house with Beds and necessary repairs.
