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Government yesterday received dispatches from Gibraltar, brought to Portsmouth by the Expedition cutter, in five days, the quickest passage ever known. Their contents are of the greatest importance, and relate not merely to the hostile disposition of Spain, but to the perilous situation of our fleet in the Mediterranean, shut out as it now is from all the Italian ports, and having only the unsafe Bays of Corsica to depend on for refuge.—The above packet is said to bring accounts of the French having entered Leghorn, and seized two English men of war; and some apprehensions were even entertained that a large part of the fleet might fall into the enemy's hands, if the wind was unfavourable for putting to sea when the French entered the place; but we have been assured from good authority that the fleet was safe; though it is conjectured to be imprudent for it to continue on its present station, and therefore it was expected at Gibraltar. The Expedition brought no private letters.

[Star.] Advices have been received from the Mediterranean, which state, that Commodore Nelson had very gallantly cut out of a port near the Gulph of Spezzia, four French ships, laden with artillery and ordnance stores, designed for the siege of Mantua.

The Jason and Galatea frigates are arrived at Falmouth from a cruise on the coast of France; the Galatea fell in with a large French frigate of about 36 guns, armed *en flote*, supposed to be laden with naval stores, which the French set fire to and burnt.

By the over-land dispatches from India we learn, that some French ships had made an unsuccessful attempt on the Fort of Diu, which is a strong town in the kingdom of Guzarat, seated in an island of the same name. It is pretty large, and fortified by a stone wall with bastions.—Guzarat is a province in Indostan, in the dominions of the Great Mogul. The attack made by the French frigates must have been merely with the view of plunder. Diu is in long. 62° 25'. E. lat. 21° 35' N.

Ennis, July 18. Saturday the Assizes for this County ended, which proved a maiden one. Died. Last Friday, at Corofin, after a lingering illness, Mr. John Enright.
