to the rich i inon, on a charge of having robbed the warehouse of his employer, of muslins, stockings, threads, &c. which it is faid he fold, and converted the money to his own use. Before he came into the employment of Mr. Spiers, it appears, he had been a clerk to other respectable merchants.

The gold coinage at the tower of London, which had been stopped since January last, we hear, is on the point of being refumed.

Yesterday arrived in our harbour, the Santisfima Trinidade, from Cadiz, under jury masts .-This vessel has been three months on her passage, and confequently confidered a misling ship.

Cork, July 30. Accounts from the channel state that all American vessels bound for British ports, are taken by the French cruizers.
