

different mercantile concerns, from that part of the world, are surely more than equivalent to the amount.

The Spaniards have long endeavoured to get Gibraltar into their hands; the Barbary Powers wish it destroyed, because it enables us to keep their depredatory views on our commerce in check—and the French have at all times assisted in forwarding the inclinations of the Spaniards to wrest it from us. But the valour of the British arms has hitherto withstood their efforts; and it is hoped that as long as the Mediterranean commerce is of any consequence to Great Britain, our enemies will not acquire by negotiation, that which they cannot conquer by force of arms.

An American Paper states, that on Saturday the 11th of June, the Hunters rendezvoused at Irvin's Lick, and produced 7941 squirrels killed by them in one day.

Yesterday a Court of Admiralty was held in Doctors' Commons, for the trial of Prize Causes, when his Majesty's Procurator General, pursuant to notice, moved for the condemnation of the unclaimed parts of the cargoes of upwards of fifty Dutch ships, which had been captured during the present war with France.

It is said that a spirit of dissatisfaction has manifested itself in a corps of Militia, embodied under a late act. Their discontent, however, did not proceed from the influence of any principles hostile to the regular government; it originated from the idea that their services were too often called upon, and too scantily rewarded. Their demands were confined solely to two objects—less duty and more pay.

DUBLIN, — AUGUST 4.

The Lord Chancellor arrived at his house in town on Tuesday evening.

The rumour of the French having notified to Portugal their determination to march an army into that country through Spain, if her Ports were not shut against the English, is said to be an artifice of the Oporto Merchants in London, to have the privilege of importing their wines, under the colour of immediate necessity, without paying the duty in money.

We have not yet received the precise Articles of the Capitulation of Franckfort; but we understand, that the Burgomasters of that city having demanded protection of property, General Jourdan replied, that he could agree to no specific terms, but that the business must be left to the honour and moderation of the French. It is said that the contribution is to be 15 millions of livres Tournois, in specie.

There is a letter in town from Port-au-Prince, that mentions, in positive terms, the arrival of two fleets, having together 14,000 land forces on board, from Europe at St. Domingo.

Friday se'nnight, came on to be tried before the Hon. Justice Chamberlain, at Armagh Assizes, an information in which the King was plaintiff, and John Greer, Esq; defendant; after a very long trial, a verdict was found against Mr. Greer. And on Monday, Mr. Coyle, of Lurgan, was brought forward for trial; but there being no prosecution, he was discharged. There was no other business of consequence.

Monaghan assizes ended the 30th ult. at which the following persons were tried before the Hon. Justice Chamberlain:

Edward Fitzpatrick, Edward Carney, and Hugh Maguire, found guilty of administering unlawful oaths to Richard Thornton and Patrick Brady, privates in the Clare Militia, to be transported for life.

Thomas Hastings, a schoolmaster, found guilty of seducing several persons to take these oaths, to be three times pillored, imprisoned 3 years, and to give security to keep the peace for seven years.

Yesterday arrived his Majesty's ship Magnanime, Hon. Captain De Courcy; left the West-India Convoy with the Assistance, 200 leagues west of Cape Clear—on the 27th captured a large ship from Amsterdam to Surinam, under Danish colours.

Also arrived his Majesty's ships Cerberus, Captain Drew, and Sea Horse, Captain Oliver, from a month's cruize, between Cape Clear and Scilly; they brought in with them L'Calvidos, a French cutter, mounting 4 six-pounders, 10 swivels, and 40 men, which they captured during their cruize. She had been from Brest four days, and had taken nothing.

Also arrived his Majesty's sloop Penguin, Captain Pulling, from a cruize in the North Channel, and for some days past between Lundy and Tusker, saw no enemy's cruizers.
