The English Committee for encouraging the Capture of French Privateers, &c. have voted a piece of Plate, of 100 guineas value, to Captain Trollope, of the Glatton, in testimony of his gallant conduct in the late Engagement.

Last week as two men, in the habit of traveling with a bear, and three dancing dogs, were on their way between Ormskirk and Wigan, they called at an Inn in Newbro', for refreshment;—they secured the bear in a brew-house, and gave him some bread to eat, but unfortunately left the door open: soon after a neighbour's wife passing by it, the animal having too much chain, rushed upon her, and tore her so much before she received assistance, that she expired about an hour afterwards. She was four months gone with child, and has left a husband and four small children to regret her loss. The men are in custody.

The brave and gallant conduct of Irish regiments when ordered on the service of their country, is not only honourable to the kingdom, but pleasing to every well-wisher of it. We remember General Maffey in 1775, marching at the head of the 27th regiment when it was going to America. There it was distinguished in several battles, and lately at St. Lucia. The valour and intrepidity of the men astonished and defeated their opponents. Colonel Gilman was appointed a Brigadier-General, and Capt. George Maffey, son to the General, who is treading in his father's steps, received the thanks of the Commander in Chief, for his intrepid and skilful conduct in action.

Brigadier General Knox, of whom Sir Ralph Abercrombie in his late dispatches makes such honourable mention, is second son of Lord Viscount Northland, of this kingdom. General Knox served with great reputation for several years in the East Indies, and particularly distinguished himself at the sieges of Cananore and Seringapatam. He was returned for the borough of Dungannon at the commencement of the present Parliament, but vacated his seat in order that he might continue his professional exertions abroad.

Lieutenant-Colonel L'Estrange, of the King's Co. Militia, is mentioned as a candidate for that county at the ensuing General Election.

The Anne, Charles M'Carthy master, and the Mary Anne, Sinclair Bates master, the last of the vessels bound from Oporta to this port, laden with wine, which were captured some time ago by the Morgan French privateer, and retaken by the Suffiante sloop, arrived here on Monday last.

Notice was given yesterday to the owners of the wines on board the Draper, the Anne, and the Mary-Anne, to pay before landing 4 guineas a pipe, and also to sign a bond for the remainder of the salvage and average expences incident on the recapture of these vessels.

The salvage on the cargoes of the above vessels was obliged to be paid in Plymouth before they were liberated.—Four guineas a pipe which is already demanded, makes about twenty-four per cent. expence on the first cost of the cargoes.

It is a melancholy fact, that within these few days quantities of woollens and other low priced goods have been returned from the county of Armagh to this city; in consequence, it is said, of the depopulation that country has suffered by the late unhappy disturbances to which it has been the victim.
