The Transport Board have caused notice to be given to all the owners, &c. of the East-Indiamen lately arrived, after carrying out troops and stores to the West-Indies, that their services will be again wanted immediately on a similar engagement, to carry out provisions, troops, and stores to the Mediterranean and West-Indies.

A large storeship is now loading at Woolwich Warren with cannon and other articles of ordnance, and a variety of stores, to go out to Quebec immediately, for supply of the British garrison in Canada, before the season of getting up the river St. Lawrence expires.

The dismissal of Colonel O'Kelly, from the West Middlesex Militia, has at length been officially transmitted to him by the Marquis of Titchfield.

Extract of a letter from Falmouth, August 7.

"Sir John Borlase Warren's Squadron came in here this morning: they have been cruizing on the French coast for several days, and though they have taken nothing, yet they have destroyed eight of the enemy's vessels, having burnt two, and drove six on the rocks. They even attempted to go into Brest water, and went so far as to cut and destroy the buoys."
