The Lord High Chancellor of Ireland continues to set a noble example to the Gentlemen of extensive Landed Property in this Kingdom: last week his Lordship visited his estates in the West of this County, great part of which being out of Lease, he directed the Tenants in possession to bid for their respective Farms, after which he executed Leases for them five shillings an acre under their own offers!

Combination among the working People, has long been known to be the very curse of this kingdom; we feel it our duty, as much as in us lies, to prevent the misguided or ignorant from incurring the penalty annexed to Combination, and therefore giving the following extract from the act passed last Session:

"And be it enacted, That any Person or Persons not duly qualified by Law to administer Oaths, who shall administer, or cause to be administered, or tender, or cause to be tendered to, or by Threats, Promises, Persuasion, or other undue Means, cause, induce, or procure to be taken by any Person or Persons any unlawful Oath, or solemn Engagement, upon a Book or otherwise, and being by due Course of Law thereof convicted, shall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and may be transported for Life, and every Person who shall take any such Oath or solemn Engagement as aforesaid, not being there-to compelled by inevitable Necessity, and being by due Course of Law thereof convicted, shall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and suffer as a Felon, and may be transported for Seven Years."
