It is true, indeed, it may likewise lefen the exports of our staple manufactures, yet ot to as great an extent as may be imagined, he Spaniards being supplied collaterally with fish Tinens during the period of hostilities with hole kingdoms.

Such was the run on the Bank of England when the Pretender marched into England as far s Derby, that, on one day, the payments were nade in filver coin only, the reckoning of which protracted the time, consequently the sums paid off could not have been very great. The news of his march back to Scotland arrived at the caapital next day, when the public fears were bated, and confidence restored, but it was some ime before any bills would be discounted

Yesterday the Gentlemen of the Bar had a Meeting at the Exhibition-House in Williamtreet, at which they resolved to embody themelves, with the approbation of Government, for he protection of the peace of the Metropolis.

The Attornies belonging to the feveral Courts net yesterday in the Chancery Chamber, and were unanimous in offering to form themfelves into a Corps, if Government approved of it, for the prefervation of the public peace.

On Tuesday night a fracas took place between the Tyrone militia and fome of the inhabitants in Effex-street, in which two or three of the citizens received confiderable injury; the houses also of one or two persons had their shop-windows broken.
