In a former pap we inserted an extract from the act for punishing Combination;—that some misguided Tradesmen have seen their error, and consequently again returned to work, we are happy in announcing; but regret that the Journeymen Coopers continue obstinate, the consequence of which will be shortly felt by them in a serious manner, and probably those who now resist the Laws, will seek to be sheltered from the indignation of the Poor of every other Trade, who being long accustomed to be supplied with cheap meat at the Slightering season, but being disappointed in consequence of our export merchants being obliged to abandon the same by the combining Coopers, will naturally turn their resentment against them, the dreadful consequences of which may be better conceived than prevented;—In thus living the public opinion, we are convinced that the Magistrates of this City are determined to use every exertion in bringing to justice all Combinators, as well as protecting the well-disposed Tradesmen.
