to facts, to judge for themselves. I only wish any plain man to weigh what has been stated, and then determine whether the French Rulers deferve to be viewed by us in any better light than any other power that had formerly been at war with us; in thort, whether they are not fighting for power and wealth, and their own aggrandizement, just as much as when they had a King; whether they care what is the Government of another country provided they can gain their own point; and whether if they thould fucceed in effecting a landing here, even the Democrats could have any thing to hope for but to be robbed and pillaged, like the rest of their countrymen. This, however, I shall endeavour to prove more fully in a following Paper.
