company shall, in case of invation, rebellion or infurrection, or the apprehention thereof, voluntarily offer to act as a military corps, and to do duty as fuch, or to march wherever it shall be Ordered within this kingdom during the continuance of fuch invation, rebellion or infurrection, or the apprehension thereof, every person therein who shall testify such his offer by puttinghis name thereto, shall upon such offer being accept ed by his Majesty, or the Chief Governor or Governors of this kingdom, be entitled, if a Commissioned Officer, to receive the fame pay as Officers of like rank receive in his Majelty's regular forces; and if a Serjeant, Trumpeter, Drummer, or Private, the same pay daily as on the days of exercise, and each be subject while he thall be to entitled, and at no other time, nor on any other ground or pretence, to the like military discipline as his Majesty's Regular or Military Forces, during the time he thall have to offered for, and no longer.

" Provided always, that no officer or foldier of any fuch corps shall be liable to be tried by any court martial, unlefs such court martial be composed entirely of officers ferving in corps formed as aforefaid, fuch court martial to be assembled by warrant from the Chief Governor or Governors of this kingdom, or by warrant from fome general or other officer duly authorifed to order courts martial to be holden.

" And be it enacted, by the authority aforefaid, that all commissioned officers of such troops or companies who shall be disabled in actual fervice shall be entitled to half pay, and all noncommissioned officers, privates, trumpeters and drummers to the benefit of the Royal Holpital at Kilmainham, and the widows of commissioned officers killed in the fervice to fuch penhon for life as is ulually given to the widows of officers of like rank in his Majetty's regular forces.

" And be it enacted, that no person who shall be enrolled in any fuch troop or company as aforefaid, shall during the time he is ferving in fuch corps be liable to ferve perfonally or to provide a fubflitute to serve in the Militia, provided he shall produce to the Deputy Governor assembled at a fub-division meeting, an affidavit of his having been enrolled as aforefaid, and a certificate figned by his commanding officer that he has for the space of fix weeks immediately preceding fuch divitional meeting punctually attended at all fuch times and places as may have been appointed for the exercise thereof, unless prevented therefrom by fickness, which fickness shall be stated in such certificate and verified

" An be it further enacted, that every perlon who shall have entered into any such troop or company before the passing of this act shall within ten days after the palling thereof or at fuch other near and convenient time as shall be appointed by his commanding officer, and every other person who shall hereafter enroll himself in any such troop or company, shall at the time he shall enroll himself take and subscribe the following

oath or affirmation of allegiance:

" I, -, do fincerely promise and swear, " that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance " to his Majesty King George the Third, and " that I will faithfully support and maintain the

" laws and constitution of this kingdom, and the " Succession to the throne in his Mujesty's illustri-

" ous house. So help me God."

Every which oath any magistrate is hereby empowered to administer, and the commanding officer shall transmit the same to his Majesty's War-Office without delay, to be enrolled from thence in his Majesty's Court of Chancery.

That if any officer shall admit or retain in his troop, &c. any perfon who shall neglect to take and fubscribe the same, or who upon being required thereto by him shall refuse to take and fubscribe it, he shall, on due conviction thereof, in any court of record be fined for every fuch offence in the fum of 500l. one half thereof to be paid to the informer, and the other half to giment in the course of the w ?
