The last letters from Gibraltar mention, that the utmost tranquillity prevailed there, and provisions were plentiful.

A large fleet of vessels under Prussian colours, from Embden, &c. have arrived in the river Thames, chiefly laden with oats and barley.

Cork, Nov. 5. A convict ship from England is arrived in the river; she is to be accompanied by one from Ireland to New South Wales.

A full Privy Council was held at the Council Chamber in Dublin, last Monday, when a Proclamation was iffued, declaring the Counties of Antrim, Down, Tyrone, Londonderry, and Armagh, in a state of Insurrection.
