We are not in the least surprised at any incondiftencies which appear in the statements of men, who have only one fixed principle, that of enmity to the existing Government, to regulate their conpuct. But we are truly happy to fay, that this is a proud day for Old England, when, in contradiction to all the falle affertions of the Opposition, and their advocates, who have invariably maintained the impossibility of raising any confiderable fum by voluntary contributions; it has been proved, that the spirit of the nation, as their confidence in the present Administration, is unimpaired; and that the pledge given by men of property, to fland forward whenever called upon, in support of the War and of the Government, was not vainly given. The fum already subscribed, in point of magnitude, and of the alacrity with which it was advanced, stands without a parallel in the annals of the world; and it must strike our enemies with difmay to find, that in the fifth year of the war, when their relources are exhaufted, we can, without the smallest difficulty, provide for the increased expences of the State.

With regard to the visionary schemes ascribed by the Opposition Writers to our Government, we shall merely observe, that they never extended beyond the circumferibed limit of their own prolific brain; and that the Minister, after taking due time to mature his plan, has adhered to it with a degree of firmnels which has been

full justified by its success.

We learn, with a degree of fatisfaction, in which all true Britons will participate, that yefterday, at the close of the books, about Fourteen Millions had been subscribed. The lift of Subferibers already comprizes many, not only of the mast eminent monied men of the City, but of the principal Nobility; and we had a very peculiar fatisfaction in hearing, that the name of His Grace the Duke of Bedford is down for One Hundred Thousand Pounds.
