He refused to go to the scaffold in the company allotted him, and his wish was allowed him. The spectators, who at such executions are never wanting, loaded the affaffin with curfes, but recovered from the revolutionary fervor, bestowed their compatition upon the unhappy face of the Emigrant. He declared upou the scaffold, that he died innocent of the calamities of his country, and recommended his foul into the hands of God.

His Majelly came to town yesterday at half past twelve, the Levee began at one, and being very thinly attended by the Nebility, was over in an hour .- The prefentations were, Mr. Franklin, Attorney-General of the Isle of Man, by the Duke of Portland; Mr. Isaac Corry, Commissioner of Customs in Ireland; and Vice-Admiral Sir Alan Gardner, on his return from his cruize off the Coall of France.

Count Rumford has prefented the Royal Society with a thouland pounds, 3 per cent. the interest of which is to be employed in two prize medals; one of gold, another of filver, for the belt discourses on the subject of light and heat. The medals are to be adjudged by the Society every fecond year; to that the prizes will amount to fixty pounds sterling in value; that is fifty fix pounds the gold; and four the filver.

It is a curious circumftance that there are two Convents still extant at Paris. One indeed is not quite within the city. During the confusion that attended the beginning of the Revolution, foldiers were quartered upon one of these Convents. The Nuns refigned part of the house to the military, and occupied the reft. Such is the fituation of that Convent now, and the Nuns are not molested .- The other Convent confented to receive a constitutional Priest, and, therefore, that also is fuffered to exist.

Advice has been received at the Eaft-India House, of the death of Serjeant Watson, who

was appointed Chief Jullice of Bengal. There was one fact, which was disclosed in the debate of yesterday: It appeared, by the Minilter's confession, that Twelve Hundred Thoufand Pounds have been fent to the Emperor, without the confent of Parliament !!! Nay, that the Minister withes for the power of continuing to lend money to his Imperial Majesty, if he think it necessary.

Copy of the Letter transmitted to all the Admirals and Captains, whose names were mentioned in the Gazette by Earl Howe, as having fignalized themselves in the action of the 1st of June, 1794, accompanying the Medal which has been prefented to them :

My Lord, or Sir.

The King having been pleafed to order a certain number of Gold Medals to be struck, in commemoration of the Victory obtained by his Majetty's Fleet under the command of Earl Howe, over that of the Enemy, in the action of the 28th and 29th of May, and ift of June, 1794, I am commanded by His Majesty to prefent to your Lordship one of the Medals abovementioned, and to fignify His Majesty's pleafure that you should wear it, when in your Uniform, in the manner described by the directions which (together with the Medal and Ribband belonging to it) I have the honour to transinit to you.

I am also commanded by His Majesty to acquaint your Lordship, that, had it been per ole for all the Officers on whom his Majetty is pleafed to confer this mark of his approbation, to attend personally in London, His Majesty would have prefented the Medal to each of them in person; but that being, from various causes, at this time impossible, His Majesty, in order to obviate all turther delay, has therefore been pleafed to direct them to be forwarded in this manner.

Allow me to exprels the great fatisfaction I feel in being made the channel of communicating to your Lordship so distinguished a mark of His

Majesty's approbation.

I have the honor to be, my Lord, or Sir, Your Lordship's most obedient humble servant, Admiralty, Nov. 30, 1796. SPENCER.
