

given. That Clergymen and Physicians be dispensed with as Visitors, excepting only in their official capacities.

That the offer of every Physician, Surgeon, or Accoucheur, to assist in promoting the object of this Charity, whether Subscriber or not, be accepted.

That two or more Physicians be nominated to each District, according to its extent, and the number that may offer for that purpose.—That each Gentleman be at liberty to visit, on any particular day, the confined Sick within his District; and that he visits each of them as often as the nature of their complaints shall require.

That one in rotation do attend, at the house, for one hour on two days in each week, to receive and prescribe for such Patients as may be recommended.

That none but Subscribers be entitled to recommend.

That the Gentlemen, who practise Midwifery, assist the Midwives of the City in difficult cases; by which many and valuable lives may be preserved to society. Application to be made at the house for their address.

To prevent one vice, which unfortunately for this City but too frequently occurs, that of "Combination," it is strongly recommended that it be publicly advertised in the different Newspapers of this City—"That any person who shall" hence forward! "be principal or abettor in any Combination, or notorious for Drunkenness, be excluded the benefits of this Charity."

As it will be indispensably necessary to administer, from time to time, Medicine as well as Nutrient, economy in the procuring one equally as the other, should claim the peculiar attention of the Society; as in proportion thereto, the Subscribers will be enabled to extend their Benevolence to the greater number of Claimants.—It is therefore agreed to,

That a Committee of 4 Physicians be elected, for the purpose of taking into consideration a list of such medicines as shall appear to them most proper to be purchased for the object of this Charity—to be compounded by an Apothecary chosen for that purpose.

That a proper person be appointed as Apothecary to this institution, he shall reside in the house, act as House-Surgeon and Steward, he shall compound the medicines agreeable to the directions of the Physicians, keep accounts in such a manner as may be pointed out to him—he shall also receive all recommendatory letters, take down a particular description of the claimant's habitation, &c. which shall be at all time open for the inspection of every Subscriber, more especially for that of the Gentlemen of the Faculty, and the Visitors.
