Extract of a letter from London, dated 14th
Inst. says, The Dutch Admiral Lucas arrived in
town on Saturday, and attended yesterday at the
Admiralty Office. He appeared much depressed
in spirits: he conversed a short time with one of
the Secretaries, but had no audience with Lord
Spencer.

A letter received yesterday from Cork, by a
Gentleman in this City, says—"Admiral Jervis
has positively taken the Santissima Trinidad,
and reports from Lisbon says, he has had another
engagement with the Spaniards 13 to 21 Ships,
and taken and destroyed 9 more."
