Brevet Major John Godfrey Drew, of the 45th Foot, is promoted to a Lieutenant-Colonelcy in the Army.

On Saturday last arrived in the Downs, His Majesty's Ship Amphitrite, Hon. Capt. Liebert, having under his convoy the Government Provision Ships that sailed from hence the 20th ult.

On Tuesday several detachments of the Tipperary Militia marched from Londonderry into Country cantonments.—The light company of that Regiment is gone to Blaris camp.

Thursday evening the remains of the late much respected John Harrison, Esq; Mayor of this City, was interred in the family Repository in St. Mary's Church-yard; on which occasion the City Regalia—the Lord Bishop, and Hon. Dean of Limerick—Rev. John and Rev. William Hoare, Curates of St. Mary's—Colonel Vereker, one of the Members for this City—Aldermen (eight senior of whom were Bearers.)—Recorder—Sheriffs.—Common Council.—Commanding Officers of Regiments in garrison, all of whom were supplied with Scarfs and Hat-bands by the Corporation,—the Merchants, and principal Citizens—formed a solemn and extensive line of march, preceded by the Londonderry Militia Band;—the Corps was first taken into the Choir of the Cathedral, where the Bishop read the Funeral Service, and from thence conveyed to the Burial Ground, where also his Lordship performed the last Religious Ceremony, in a manner that impressed the crowded auditory with a decent seriousness which we never witnessed on any similar occasion.
