Belfast, April 17. Friday night last, at half
after eight o'clock, Colonel Barber, with a party
of the Royal Fencibles, went to the house of John
Alexander, inn-keeper, Peter's-hill, in this town,
and apprehended 21 persons assembled there—
all of whom, with some papers seized at the
same time, were immediately lodged in the Ar-
tillery Barracks, where they now remain.

On Saturday ten prisoners, under an escort of
the County Kerry Militia, were brought from
Londonderry and lodged in the Artillery Bar-
racks of this place.—In the evening they were
sent on board the tender as disorderly persons.
