HOUSE OF COMMONS.—Tuesday—May 30. Reported with amendments, the bill for preventing the seduction of his Majesty's forces, as also the debtors maintenance bill—ordered to be engrossed. Mr. M. Beresford moved, that Mr. J. Potts, proprietor of Saunders's News-Letter, and Mr. V. Dowling, note-taker to the same, be ordered to the bar, to receive a reprimand pursuant to the resolution of the House. Mr. Speaker addressed them in language marked with dignity, mildness and condescension. He told them they were guilty of a breach of the privileges of that House, privileges which it became the duty of every man in the nation both to know and respect. They had wilfully misrepresented the speech of a Right Hon. Member of the House, by ascribing to him sentiments the very reverse of what he uttered, and attributing to him suspicions unfavourable to the loyalty of a body of men, the armed Yeomanry of Ireland, who were unanimously and justly thanked by both Houses of Parliament, for their spirited exertions in preparing to defend their native country at the hour of threatened invasion by a sanguinary and ferocious enemy. That however having expressed due compunction for conduct so extremely reprehensible, the House shewed themselves willing, by a very conspicuous lenity, to admit an acknowledgement of their error as an extenuation of it. He exhorted them to keep in mind a sense of their duty to the public as publishers of a newspaper, and never be led to forget the awful veneration they were peculiarly bound to preserve towards the privileges of the House. It was the unanimous sense of the House that they should be reprimanded. He therefore accordingly reprimanded them, and ordered them to be discharged from the custody of the Serjeant at Arms, paying their fees.
