conducted with a solemnity highly becoming the melancholy occasion.—The Prisoners, having in the most unequivocal manner acknowledged their guilt in taking the Oath, as dictated by the United Irishmen, seemed determined as much as in them lay, to expiate their crime, by warning the surrounding soldiery to be faithful to their Oath of Allegiance, and support that Constitution which they were bound to defend.—Their Corpses were taken for interment to the front of Stoneville Camp.

Immediately after the above execution, part of the Royal Tyrone Regiment proceeded for Tarrbert and Killarney, from whence the Louth Regiment had just marched for Ardfinan Camp.

On Monday evening, the Yeomen Corps, took the Guards of this City, in order that the Military should attend the above execution,—and continued on duty till relieved this morning by part of the Tyrone Regiment.

A letter from Dublin dated last Monday night, says—“Letters from London assure, that the Lancaster has submitted, and that there is an almost certainty of the Mutineers at the Nore being reduced.—The French fleet are in a state of anxiety.—Lord Yelverton, in his charge to the Grand Jury of the County of Antrim, affirmed, that the Oath of the United Irishmen, under the present circumstances of the country, amounts to High Treason—he took the Oath of Allegiance, the Sheriff and Jury the same, and so of the people of Carrickfergus,—at which, when he adjourned the Court, 3000 took the Oath.—Arms were delivered up in abundance, and upwards of 2000 persons were to come in the day the letter was written.”
