If any circumstance was wanting to raise the character of the British Navy in the good opinion of all loyal subjects, surely the conduct of all the Officers of his Majesty's ships at the Nore must command universal applause. From what can be collected from the trial of *President Parker*, their conduct evinces the most calm and deliberate courage, when deprived of their command, and even when in the actual power of a treasonable banditti; and as humanity and candour are ever to be found in the brave, their demeanour on the trial, free from all resentment of insult and outrage, must raise them in the esteem and love of all worthy men. The investigation of this unhappy business, conducted with such tenderness and lenity to the unfortunate prisoner, is an additional proof of the virtue and equity of our glorious Constitution.

The military establishment of this kingdom is to be further augmented by five regiments now on their march to sea-port towns in England, for embarkation.

Belfast, June 26. On Saturday last, the Rev. Mr. Bristow was elected Sovereign of Belfast, for the ensuing year.

On Wednesday last, there was a meeting held at Armagh, of the General Committee of the 34 Lodges of Freemasons belonging to that County, when several resolutions were agreed to, and a declaration made of their determination to support his Majesty and the Constitution.

We understand, that on the 23d inst. Generals Lake and Nugent, attended by a party of Dragoons, went to Ballinahinch, and the neighbourhood of it, in search of concealed arms; and that in consequence of their remonstrances, a large number of fire arms and pikes were delivered up, and the inhabitants of that country are bringing in their concealed arms every day.

Two six pounders were delivered up by Mr. Adair Bell, of Ballymena, and lodged in the Artillery Barracks on Friday last.

We have certain intelligence, that many of the inhabitants of the Counties of Armagh and Tyrone have availed themselves of the lenity of the late Proclamation, by surrendering themselves as United Irishmen, and entering into recognizance for their future good behaviour; and that the greatest number of them have delivered up their arms.

The 18 persons apprehended in the County of Down on Thursday night last, are supposed to have been active leaders, and agitators among the United Irishmen.

On Saturday last, Andrew Bryson was brought in prisoner from Newtownards—charged with seditious practices.

Yesterday the Rev. Mr. Stavely, from Knockbracken, was also brought to town, and lodged in the Artillery Guard-house.
