

The peace between the Emperor and the French Republic has had no visible effect on the funds in London, nor also, what on former occasions would have been an event considered as extremely alarming, the suspension of payment of the interest now due on the Imperial loan, hitherto considered on the faith of Parliament as a national stock. This very stock has felt no depression, and the consols remain stationary at 49; which is the firmness possessed by the Londoners of this day!

Since Mantua is to become the strong northern frontier or bulwark of the Cisalpine Republic, it is very evident that the Emperor is not left any where of Italy, unless where the province of Tyrol extends southward a few miles and the German mountains into Lombardy. In Istria and Dalmatia, were he even permitted by treaty to keep them, they are not in provinces, but part of the western extreme of northern Greece. Thus Francis the first will be deprived of those hereditary territories, which were the most fertile regions in Europe, and independent of his particular feelings, that occasion, will totally lose that power which he had so very long enjoyed.
