So great are the quantities of coarse hats imported of late from Liverpool into this city, that the trading communication with the central parts of this country for such fabrics is much diminished. One cause of this demand being diverted into another channel is, that the price of common wool is cheaper in England than here, and another very principal reason may be, that from nine to twelve months credit is given by the British manufacturer to the Irish shopkeepers.—Several hundred woollen hats are almost every week imported into this city only.

Cork, Jan. 7. The Lord Chancellor has been pleased to appoint Robert Harding, Esq; one of the late Sheriffs of this City, a Justice of the Peace for the County. This was done at the special request of the Grand Jury.

Some valuable pieces of Plate, with a suitable inscription, have also been voted to Mr. Harding, by the Mayor, Sheriffs, and Commonalty of this City.

LIMERICK.—JANUARY 12.

Major Edward Fitz Gerald, late of the 10th Regiment of Foot, is appointed Town Major of Limerick, vice Bindon, deceased.

We are concerned to state, that a spirit of outrage has broken out in the West of the County of Clare, which will require the strong arm of Justice to put down.—On Wednesday night a large party of Insurgents armed with fire Arms, Pikes, &c. attacked the house of Andrew Lysaght, Esq; near Ennistymon, where they met an unexpected resistance, and in defending which we are sorry to hear, that Edward Dalton, Esq; of Nutfield, received a gun shot wound in the Arm:—On Thursday night, above 300 Defenders armed as above, went to the house of Edward Wm. Burton, of Clifden, Esq; who unfortunately happened not to have any assistance; after firing several shots therein and breaking into a Window, they obtained from him, three muskets and a sword, when they went off, first cutting down and taking with them, an elegant Plantation of young Trees, for the purpose of making Pike-handles;—they also broke open and destroyed the Church of Ennistymon.

This morning a Troop of the Romney Fencible Cavalry, marched hence for Ennis, in the County of Clare.

On Thursday night last, a Turf Boat, belonging to Mich. Prendergast, going hence to Clarefield in ballast, was run foul by another Turf boat coming up the river laden with culm;—unfortunately the former sunk near Aughinoth, and with great difficulty four men who were in the former, escaped with their lives.
