

An Address signed by above 700 of the Free-men, Freeholders, and principal Merchants and Traders of Cork, was last week presented to the Earl of Charlemont, and the Right Hon. John Foster, Speaker of the House of Commons, expressive of their Thanks to them, and such of the Peers and Commons as voted against a Union.

Two of the Men who were shot at New Geneva, as mentioned in the last page of this Paper, were Philip Hogan, from near O'Callaghan's Mills, and Andrew Ryan, of Broadford;—they had been both sentenced at the late Court Martial in this City, to serve in the West Indies.

Yesterday was brought in and lodged in Gaol, by Lieut. Apjohn, and a party of the Coonagh Cavalry, James Keogh, charged with being concerned in the murder of the Dwyers, on the lands of Lisnakeilly, and burning their houses, as lately mentioned.

The above mentioned Keogh, was convicted of being concerned in the late Rebellion, was sentenced to be transported, and after being on board ship was liberated (as he says) on bail.
