Abstract from the Road Act:—"Be it enacted, that no Person shall Ride or Drive any Horse, Beast, or other Cattle, willingly or unnecessarily on any Foot-Path.—Any Person so offending, shall upon conviction, by the oath of one credible witness, before any Justice of the Peace within his jurisdiction, or upon the view of any such Justice, forfeit a sum not exceeding 10s. for every such offence."

The Accounts of the Kitchen Committee, for the last month, being examined, it appeared that within said period 566 persons were supplied with 3778 shares of bread and broth, or gruel, and that 98 shares were dispensed on account of tickets sold by the Society at 1s. 1d. per dozen, and that the expence of the whole amounted to 14l. 4s. 5d.—It also appeared, that within said period, 311 persons were prescribed for and received Medicines.—The funds of this most useful Institution being very nearly exhausted, and several Persons having refused to pay even the arrears due by them for the last year,—a full Meeting of the Superintending Committee is earnestly requested on Saturday next, at 12 o'clock.
