LIMERICK.—APRIL 6.

Sir Vere Hunt's Corps of Fencibles, marched from Worcester on Monday se'nnight, for the Isle of Wight.

Thomas Rice, Esq; having resigned being Assistant Barrister for the County of Kerry; the Lord Lieutenant has been pleased to appoint his nephew Stephen Henry Rice, Esq; to be his successor.

The Brig Chateau Margo, Captain Sands, of and for this Port, from Oporto, laden with wine and fruit, was taken the 26th of February, by two Spanish privateers, retaken the next day by the Flora frigate, and is arrived at Lisbon, from whence she was ready to sail the 12th ult.

Yesterday, James and Robert Mangane, convicted before the General Court-Martial on Monday last, for murdering Patrick Mangan;—John Kelly, alias Shawn Buoy, and John Sullivan, convicted before said Tribunal, with robbing Edmond Carmody, were hanged on the New-Bridge;—most of the Troops in Garrison attended at the Execution.

Patrick Kelly, (son to the before-mentioned John Kelly,) James Lacey, Patrick David Kelly, and John Cavenagh, who were also convicted of Carmody's robbery, were pardoned at the foot of the Gallows, and are to be transported for life.

The bodies of the Culprits who were hanged yesterday, were interred in the back ground of the intended New Goal.
