### LIMERICK.—APRIL 13.

The following letter was sent by Admiral Kingmill to the General, commanding at Cork.  
"Cove, April 8, 1799.

"Dear General,

"I herewith send you a packet of importance, which you will please forward by express to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; it is brought by a Captain Stokes, who is charged with dispatches from India for Mr. Dundas, of such consequence that I give him a passage in a cutter to Bristol, where I hope he will be landed by noon to-morrow; I congratulate you on the news I understand it contains, viz. "The total Extermination of the French Interest in India, and that 14,000 Men have Laid Down their Arms."

The Vine, —, from London, for this Port, sailed from Gravesend the 5th inst.

Thomas Dubigg, who was tried on Monday last and convicted by the General Court Martial for robbing James D'Arcy, Esq; and for being an active sworn United Man, is to be hanged on Monday next at Dromard, near Rathkeal; his body is afterwards to be dissected.

Yesterday the General Court Martial assembled for the trials of Cornelius, Edward, Thomas, and Dennis Gorman, (Brothers), charged with the robbery of James D'Arcy, Esq; of Knockaderry, and with seditious practices;—sentence not known.

The Court-Martial which has been assembled since Monday the 11th inst. was this day dissolved: another will be convened next week.

The Lydia, Callaghan, from New-York, with Flax-seed, &c. arrived in this port the 11th inst. after a passage of 29 days;—she has not brought any intelligence.

This day arrived the Morning Star, with flax-seed and staves, from Philadelphia, she sailed from thence the 13th of Feb. last, and was detained by the ice at Port Penn, in the Delaware, till the 4th of last month.
