Letters from Venice, dated the 13th, mention, that the Rullian and Turkish fleets, with a confiderable number of transports, had been leen from the heights of Ancona, coming from Corfu. The service which their troops are expected to undertake is, to drive the French out of the Ecclesiastical States and the Neapolitan dominions.

The Rullian corps now on their march through Gallicia, Austrian Silefia, and Moravia, comprife 43.000 men; magazines are forming in Bohemia for their accommodation. Another Ruffian army is forming on the Polish trontiers, and

Letters from Hamburgh mention, that Mr. Wiggers. Agent from that city at Peterfburgh, was, on the 24th of March, ordered to quit his Imperial Majetty's dominions, but the next day he was told he might remain, as the agent of Lubeck and Bremen.

Six hundred Hinoverians are about to take possession of the port of Cuxhaven, as a matter

of necessary precaution.

It is mentioned in feveral letters, that the King of Prussia will take part with the coalition. A sudden order came to Embden from Berlin just before the departure of the post, ordering that the further exportation of oats should be strictly prohibited from the ports of East Friezeland .-The letters add, that they would be wanted for the Prussian Cavalry.
