The Duke of Rutland arrived in Dublin, from England, on Tuesday last.

Last week, a match for 40 guineas was run over the course of Rathkeal, between Mr. Cox's bay gelding Hark-away. (late Mr. Canny's Kicker,) and Captain R. D. Spread's bay mare Comfort, 3 three-mile heats, which was won by the former: remarkable close running—the gentlemen rode their own horses.

Yesterday was brought in by a party of the Kilkishin Cavalry, under command of Lieut. Bentley, and committed to the County Gaol, Thomas Uniacke, charged with being concerned in a conspiracy to Poison the Officers of the Clare Militia;—he was apprehended the day before, passing through Sixmile-Bridge, on his way (as he said) to Crofheen.

Same day, Edward Connor was taken from the County Cells, by a guard of the Fayle Cavalry, under the command of Lieut. Church, to Castle Island, where he is to be hanged pursuant to the sentence of a General Court Martial, for the murder of the Yeomen as before mentioned.

Yesterday, some Soldiers of the 4th Regiment, discovered in a quarry at Newtown Pery, three Hands and the Foot of Human Bodies—quite fresh;—enquiry the most minute has been made to trace the cause, but hitherto without effect.
