

The trial of one of the two Forristals, charged with the murder of Messrs. James's (father and son,) farmers of the county of Wexford, comes on this day before a Court Martial. The other Forristal cousin of the first mentioned, died in prison a few days ago. His death was imputed to the apprehensions he entertained, after being visited in gaol by a person he knew, that was to be his prosecutor.

They were put to death in a most cruel manner: after being desperately piked, by a banditti of Rebels, some of the savages, while life was in the unfortunate men, dropped large stones upon their heads, which broke their skulls to atoms.
