

POSTSCRIPT.

This Evening arrived One Packet.

DANTZIC, July 26.

ESTERDAY arrived in this road a Russian Imperial Squadron of seven ships of the line and a 44 gun ship; which, having taken in provisions, &c. continued their voyage to the East.

LONDON, Aug. 14.

The following Official Bulletin was published yesterday:

AUG. 13.—The 31st ult. Lord Keith was aboard the *St. Vincent*, with 31 sail of the line, of which were three deckers, supposed to be two days behind the Combined Fleets.

The First Division of the Secret Expedition departed yesterday morning, at one o'clock.

Yesterday morning, and not before, the whole of the Fleet assembled under the command of Admiral Mitchell, and having on board Sir John Abercrombie and the troops embarked for the Secret Expedition, sailed from the Downs with the wind at South, which was perfectly favourable for the course they seemed to steer. [Sun.]

In addition to the intelligence which we yesterday communicated, brought by the Telegraphic brig from Lord Keith's fleet, we are enabled to state, that immediately previous to the departure of the British fleet, the signal was made for three line of battle ships to stand into a bay near Lagos, and cut out a Spanish line of ships lying there without a main top mast. The *Imperieux*, of 78 guns, commanded by Sir John Pellew, was one of the ships selected for service, which we therefore have every reason to hope was promptly and effectively performed. [Ibid.]

It is the general opinion that our fleet, with the winds which have prevailed, might reach the straits of Brest by the 11th inst. in which case we shall soon have further intelligence respecting it.

An American ship sent into Plymouth by the *St. Vincent* frigate, we have the following particulars. In the night of the 8th, the *Stag* was being run down by a French frigate, and discovered that she was in the middle of the Combined Fleet. The fleet was then off Corunna steering for the Bay. This is all the information on the subject we have been able to obtain.

Yesterday morning arrived the *Hamburgh Mail*, of the 1st Sunday. It brings little intelligence of importance, except the surrender of the strong town of Leo, in the Ecclesiastical State. The armies of Italy seem to be waiting for the Mantua and the citadel of Alexandria before they resume offensive operations; and the pleasure may be assigned for the inactivity of the Archduke. The operations against Mantua and Alexandria are carried on with vigour.

It may prevent many persons from incurring heavy penalties, by attending to the following Extracts from the late Game Act:

"£20 penalty for using Dogs, Guns or Nets, for taking Game, without a Certificate.

"Persons found using Dogs, &c. for Destruction of Game, who do not produce Certificates on demand of Persons producing theirs, or do not tell their Names and places of Abode, &c. forfeit £50.

"Persons carrying Guns or Nets over Land, deemed in pursuit of Game.

"Certificates not to authorize taking Game contrary to Law, nor to authorize Persons not qualified.

"Offenders convicted, who may not have sufficient goods to answer the penalty, are to be committed to the Common Goal or House of Correction, for the space of six Months, unless such penalty shall be sooner paid."
