ter having expelled the reft of the French from that country, will march to Switzerland, to unite itlelf, under the command of Marthal Suwarrow, with that which replaces the Austrians. This army will be augmented by the Swifs and Wir-

On this plan, each army is commanded by a General of its own nation. The left wing of the army of Switzerland communicates with that of Italy, from which, when necessary, it will receive affiltance. The right wing will join the army of the Rhine, with which its movements will be concerted .- The object of Marshal Suwarrow will be to reach the frontiers of France. Then Mansier (Count d'Arrois), at the head of the corps of Conde, and of the Swifs troops of which he is Colonel General, will iffue a proclamation in the name of Louis XVIII. concerted with the Allied Powers ; and this proclamation will be immediately followed by the entrance of the army which will endeavour to penetrate towards Paris, thro' Burgundy. In the mean time the Archduke, sfeer having forced the French to evacuate the Right bank of the Rhine, will blockade Mayence, or even befiege that key of the empire, and excite an infurrection in the Electorates on the left bank, and form a junction with the Anglo-Ruffian army of Holland,

The transports that have been taken up to carry the rroops to the Continent, have been moftly hired for three months certain, and the general price has been 61. per ton per month.

The Eagle, Dutch prison ship, at Chatham, is ordered to be converted into a hospital ship, in lien of the Victory, of 100 guns, which is ordered to be docked and fitted for fervice.
