Helder, is the name of the most northerly coast of the Peninsula of Holland, to the Southward of the Texel Illand, along which on the itarboard, with that Island on the larboard, is the channel into the Texel Road within the Mand.-There are three channels by which thips come from feaward to this point of land; and the Land-deep, which runs up northward along the flore; the Slenk, which is between the Keyler's- Flat and the South Sand, and the Spaniard's Gat, between the Texel Island and the Keyler's Flat. All thele unite athward of the N. W. point of the Helder.
