DUBLIN.—Sept. 23.

The importance of the recent successes in Holland can be appreciated only by those who enter into the whole of the case. In addition to the fleet of Russians which has been subsidized, there were 18 sail of the British line off the Texel, a greater number of which, exclusive of the operation of the Dutch fleet, are now at liberty to act in any other situation the nature of the service may require. The heretofore expence of the Northern Armament has exceeded two millions annually.

Had the Dutch ships resisted, they might, from the nature of their situation, have been able to withstand the united power of the British Navy. The Vlerer, into which Admiral Storey retired, is a passage between two shoals, and so narrow that three ships abreast would occupy the entire space, and where that number of vessels, by having springs on their cables, could always present their broadsides, while an assailing ship, even with a leading wind, must approach end on, able only to fire her bow chasers; for, from the extreme danger they must be liable to, under the most favourable circumstances, of getting on the bank at either side of this channel, no ship would venture to back and fill, which would be the only means of occasionally bringing a broadside to bear upon an enemy. Happily the Dutch sailors, who have always been attached to the House of Orange, ruined the night Storey took this position, and actually threw one person overboard who attempted to oppose the general will.
