General Lake is expected in town every day.
On Saturday last, 22 men were brought into
this city prisoners, by the Barrymore Cavalry,
by whom they were apprehended the preceding
night, at a place in the neighbourhood of Mal-
low called Coomb Mountain. It appears that a
practice has prevailed of late about the country,
for large parties to assemble, at a late hour, un-
der the specious pretence of dancing at some
barn or cabin, and when the meeting has been
sufficiently strong, to issue forth and administer
the United Oath to the timid inhabitants of the
neighbourhood. Positive information to this ef-
fect had been given against the persons composing
this meeting, in consequence of which they were
taken into custody.

The General Court Martial at present sitting

United Irishmen, and acting as Captains and
Leaders in the late rebellion, and forming a plot

and Castlelyons.
