country, in the evening of life. The following anecdote of the brave and able Colonel Hay, we feel a pleafure in recording .-When ferving abroad last war, a live shell thrown from a neighbouring battery, happened to fall close by the fide of a private foldier, who was then tied fast to the halberts, undergoing the sentence of his Court-Marrial; the sudden appearance of fo destructive an evil created fuch terror and alarm amongst the persons attending the punishment, as to occasion them to fly in all directions, to avoid, if possible, the impending danger. The Colonel, regardless of his own fafery, deliberately took from his wailtcoat pocket a penknife, and walking up to the prisoner, immediately cut the cords with which he was bound, and fer him free, who with his deliverer, had fearcely sufficient time to get away, before the shell burit : Thus at the risk of his own life, did he preserve a culprit that otherwise inevitably must have perished, from his inability at the moment to extricate himfelf.

On Friday and Saturday le'nnight arrived at Aberdeen, the first two divisions of the Princels Charlotte of Wales' or M'Lleod Fencibles, on

If the determination of the Magistrates to prosecure the owner of this house be carried into effect, it will put an end to one of the ways in which ruffians now dispose of the property obsained by robbery and murder.

An attempt was made by a gang of villains, on Sunday night last, to get entrance into the house of Mr. Wilfon, of High-street, with a view, no doubt, to plunder it, by rapping at the halldoor, and when asked from within, ' who was there?' a villain without replied, that Mr. W. had fallen in the street, near his house, and was unable to get home. The fervant within knowing this to be a falfehood, faid he would not open the door; the fellow finding this stratagem not fucceed, then faid he had some papers for Mr. W. to deliver, and defired the fervant to open the door and receive them. The latter fill adhered closely to caution, and would not do to, defiring the fellow to put any paper he had under the door; the ruffin accordingly put in some papers that way, expecting that the fervant would then be off his guard, and comply; but on examining them, they were found to be deceptions made up for the purpose, and the efforts of the villains failed. The caution of the fervant deferves great applause-for it appears there was a large gang of these sellows lurking about the door, watching to get entrance by these stratagems into the house. Upon no account should a servant open a hatldoor at night, to a rap, without knowing well
